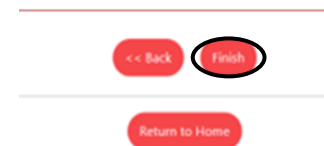
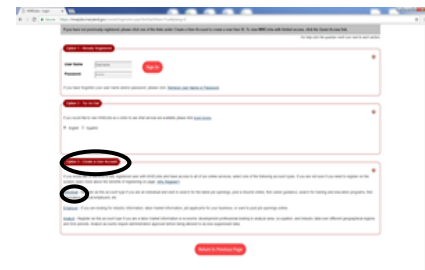
HOW TO REGISTER IN MWE
